## **MARKING SCHEME CRE**

- 1 a) The second creation story (Gen 2:4-23)
  - i) The creation of heaven and earth is assumed to have taken place.
  - ii) God created man out of the dust of the earth and breath "the breath of life" into his nostrils.
  - iii) He planted the ground of the garden in Eden.
  - iv) Out of the ground of the garden God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food.
  - v) He also planted a tree of knowledge of good and evil in the midst of the garden.
  - vi) He made four rivers to water garden.
  - vii) God took the man he had created and put him in garden of Eden.

    - v) He prayed and God told him to hit the water with the rod and there was a path through.
    - vi) The Egyptians chariots who followed them were swept by the water at the Red Sea.
    - vii) Direction When the lack direction he prayed and God provided the pillar of cloud and the pillar of fire.

    - v) Israel misunderstood the concept of divine election. They imagine that correct sacrifice and ceremony would automatically bring Yahweh's favour on them.

  - v) Jeremiah talks of impending judgement (dicadess, Jesus predicted of the judgement in the last days.
